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DTU's Award for Developing Teaching & Learning

Objective:

- to support and encourage DTU teachers to systematically investigate how various teaching methods support student education
- to recognise exceptional effort to develop teaching and learning methods at DTU
- to support the ongoing enhancement of the quality of teaching, learning and education at DTU

Eligibility:

Individual teachers – or teams of teachers – who have made an exceptional contribution to the development of teaching to enhance student education.

The award consists of

- A travelling scholarship of 25,000 DKK to be used for activities that can support further development of teaching & learning (conferences, study trips, study retreat...)
- A trophy to be placed in the winner's department for a year + a small copy for the winner to keep
